

ABOUT SOME OF THE WINERIES

Concha Y Toro

Founded by Don Melchor de Concha y Toro in 1883, the wine company is one of the largest in the world. Originally located in Santiago, Chile, they now have vineyards in both Argentina and the United States and has grown to be the greatest producer and exporter of wines from Latin America. More recently, they became the second largest wine business in the United Kingdom, through their production of their ever-popular Sauvignon Blanc, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon wines.

Franschhoek Cellar

The town of Franschhoek, situated between the towering mountains of the Cape winelands was founded by French Huguenots (Protestants) in 1688. Operating as a private cellar, the estate was established in 1920 and has been built off of a community of grape farmers in the Franschhoek Valley for the last 300 years. The wines produced have a distinctive personality that mimics the grace and charm of the Huguenot heritage that the town originates from. Producing a range of three white and three red varietal wines, the cellar represents the beauty of country life with the elegance of a world class wine estate.

Botter

The winery began as a very small roadside company in 1928, when Carlo Botter and his wife, Maria, started selling wines in barrels. Currently, thanks to the company's 'multi-terroir' approach, Botter is one of the largest producers and exporters of Italian wine. In today's market, 1 out of 20 bottles of Italian wine exported to the world is produced by Botter.

Jackson Estate

Marlborough is New Zealand's largest wine region, producing around 79% of the countries wine. Although Jackson Estate is relatively new to the wine world, they have their own individual style of winemaking. The goal of the estate is "to embrace Old-World winemaking practices using New-World technology". Utilising the cool evening climate and 'Burgundy-esque' daytime heat, the grapes have the advantage of a long, slow, flavour-intensifying ripening period.

Terrazas De Los Andes

Located at the foothills of the Andes in the Mendoza wine region of Argentina, the company prides itself on their goal of high-altitude winemaking. The founder, Hervé Birnie-Scott, now nicknamed "el loco frances" (the crazy Frenchman) due to his high-risk, high-reward ventures in the Andes, set out to capture the pure, fresh taste of these unique terroirs. While it may be easier to navigate charted territory, Terrazas de los Andes embarked on a journey to create wines from the most extreme reaches of Argentina, where the Earth meets the sky.

Domaine Jerome Quiot

The Quiot Family, winemaker since 1748 has established, over the centuries and throughout family histories, wonderful vineyards in the South Rhône Valley and in Provence. Through strong, generation-lasting values of heritage and terroir respect, the family have expanded their winery and export 97% of their produce to more than 30 countries.
